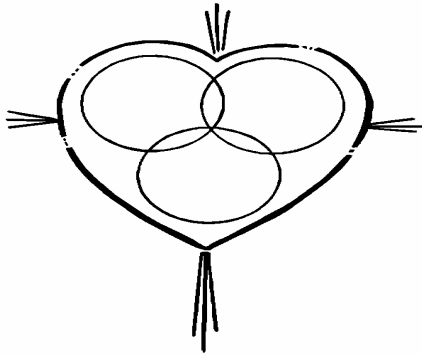

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

I am writing from Halifax, Nova Scotia.

I am here for the convention of the Catholic Theological Society of America. In order to become a member of this Society, one needs to have a doctorate in theology. I am here with several other priests from the Diocese of Camden.

Our taxi driver from the airport to the hotel identified himself as a Catholic!! He used to deliver church bulletins to all 57 parishes in the Diocese of Halifax.

One of the first friends I met was Camelia, who was born in Pakistan and now lives in Canada. She taught for many years in a Catholic Seminary in Buffalo, NY, but is now retired. She also works tirelessly for refugees.

The theme of our convention is "Impasse . . . and Beyond." We live in a world, and in a church, in which things get stuck! How can we break the logjam and get things moving again? This is our theme. In the next few days, I'll hear many talks on this topic, and how it applies to prayer, the Bible, relationships with other religions and social justice.

When I get back, I'll let you know some of the ideas that I heard.

Meanwhile, I'm happy to see that five families have signed up for the community garden. There is still space for another 3 or 4 families. Call the rectory (856-962-8642) to reserve space for your family. You get to keep the food from the garden!!

Many blessings on everyone from the good people of Nova Scotia, once a predominantly Catholic area, until the British drove the Catholics out. Many of the Catholics went down the Mississippi and settled in New Orleans!!
