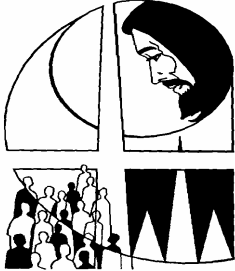

From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Please remember in your prayers Mrs. Eleanor Osinski Torres, the mother of Lisa Soto, who died this past week and will be buried from our church on Monday morning. Mrs. Torres came to our church regularly. Her daughter, Lisa, is one of the leaders of our Latino community and her son-in-law, Angel Soto plays the guitar in our choir.

November is the month in which we remember our loved ones who have died. This year, for the first time, I'll be remembering my Mother. She died on November 25, 2008, on the 11th anniversary of the death of her son, Charlie, her oldest.

November is an appropriate month for remembering those who have died. The trees around us seem to be dying as their leaves give up their green and turn brown and red and yellow and orange. Nature is going into a dormant state for the winter. It is a sort of dying. Resurrection will come in the spring, when the green shoots will rise from the land to remind us that death does not have the final word, but resurrection always follows.

As we think about death and resurrection, we can look at our current merger and the accompanying changes that will happen in our parish and remind ourselves that all of the loss and sadness will be followed by new life. Change is always stressful, but it can lead to new life.

This week, I'll meet with Bishop Gallante and ten pastors to determine the shape of the ministry for the Latino people along the Black Horse Pike. Please remember me and the pastors in your prayers. Fr. Rico Ducle will also attend the meeting.

I encourage everyone to give Fr. Ducle a warm welcome to the parish. He will be working for our parish and the nearby parishes. He will live in St. Joan of Arc rectory. Fr. Ducle is young and full of life. He is a priest with a good head and a good heart and he will be a blessing for our parish.

Our parish has had a long history with many priests who served the people well. As we welcome Fr. Ducle, we can remember that we are part of the flow of history. I have been very happy to be your pastor for the past nine years. Now, I'll move on to a new assignment with the hope that I'll be able to minister well to the people whom I meet there.

Stewardship Reflection *Stewardship Satisfaction*

Stewardship can grow on us as we strive to give our time, talent and treasure to serve our Church. The satisfaction we receive from our service is promised in the Beatitudes.

November CAP Schedule

CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the diocese is that adults will attend CAP once every 5 years.

CAP 1 teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for **new** volunteers and employees.

CAP 2 is No More Bullies, No More Victims and is a workshop on bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyberbullying is also addressed. Both sessions are 90 minutes.

Adults must attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1 again if they prefer.
